- Class II ATV A motorized off-highway vehicle, 58 inches or traveling on four or more low-profile, low-pressure tires (10 pounds per square inch or less) and having a bench seat. less in width, having a dry weight of 700 pounds or less,

It is a violation of the ATV Law not to report an ATV accident to the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources' Bureau of Forestry, P.O. Box 8552, Harrisburg, PA 17105

Accident forms are available upon request from the Snowmobile/ATV Unit, Bureau of Forestry, State Parks and State Police stations.

LIABILITY

Liability for negligence in the use or operation of an ATV is attributable to the owner of the ATV.

ATV FUND

All registration fees are deposited in a special ATV Fund. The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources uses monies from this fund to carry out the ATV registration, safety education and law enforcement requirements of the ATV Law and to establish and maintain ATV trails.

NFORCEMENT

All law enforcement officers in the state, including local and state police, are authorized to enforce the ATV Law.

An ATV may make a direct crossing of a street or two-lane highway provided:

- The crossing is made at an angle of approximately 90 degrees to the direction of the highway and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing;
- The ATV is brought to a complete stop before crossing the highway;
- The driver yields the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an immediate hazard.

It is illegal to operate an ATV:

- At the rate of speed that is unreasonable or improper under existing conditions or in excess of the maximum limits posted for vehicular traffic;
- In a careless way so as to endanger the person or property of another;
- 3. While under the influence of alcohol, narcotics or drugs.

ACT SAFELY

EQUIPMENT

All ATVs operating in Pennsylvania must be equipped with: a brake system capable of producing deceleration of 14 feet per second at a speed of 20 miles per hour; and a muffler in good working order. The sound intensity produced by an ATV may not exceed 99dbA, or decibels, when measured at 20 inches.

All ATVs operated during hours of darkness or when visibility is less than 500 feet must be equipped with an operating headlight and taillight. The headlight must produce a white light sufficient to reveal persons and vehicles at a distance of 100 feet. The taillight must produce a red light plainly visible during darkness from a distance of 500 feet.

ATV TRAILS

Certain trails on State Forest land and the Allegheny National Forest have been designated for ATV use. Additional information on ATV trails is available from the Snowmobile/ATV Unit.

HELMETS

It is illegal to operate an ATV without a securely fastened helmet on the head of the operator.

TITLES

All ATVs in Pennsylvania must have a title issued by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. The only exceptions to this are those ATVs registered with the Department prior to Feb. 12, 1987. These ATVs will not require a title until they are sold by the owner.

FINES

Failure to register your ATV may result in a fine of \$300.

A violation of other provisions of the ATV Law is punishable by a fine of no less than \$25 or more than \$100 plus the cost of prosecution and for a second offense a fine of no less than \$50 or more than \$200 plus the cost of prosecution.


